Life, senior ac ve and junior ac ve members shall be eligible to par cipate in all classes at Regular Compe ons, Even ng Compe ons at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Compe ons at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaul ng Compe ons and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may par cipate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Compe ons, Even ng Compe ons, Dressage Compe ons, Reining Compe ons and Combined Driving Compe ons upon payment of a \$30 Show Pass fee. Par cipants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibi ons; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Compe ons. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) ci zens of other na ons who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own Na onal Federa on, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Federa on Entry Agreement

By entering a Federa on-licensed Compe on and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representa ves, employees and agents, lagree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federa on, Inc. (the "Federa on") and the local rules of the compe on. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federa on and of the compe on. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Commi ee on any ques on arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the compe on, the Federa on, their officials, directors and employees for any ac on taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or par cipate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condigon of and in considerag on of acceptance of entry, the Federa on and/or the compe on may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the compe on for the promo on, coverage or benefit of the compe on, sport, or the Federa on. Those likenesses shall not be used to adver se a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connec on with such use, including any claim to compensa on, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropria on. The construc on and applica on of Federa on rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any ac on ins tuted against the Federa on must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

GR407.1-3: For every horse par cipa ng in any compe on licensed by the Federa on, a \$16 Federa on Fee will be collected (\$8 shall be an Equine Drugs & Medica on Fee to provide for research, inspec on & enforcement of rules regarding use of medica ons and drugs.

Entries

ENTRIES CLOSE the Thursday preceding each show at 3:00 pm. All horses entered must be named on the entry blank including horses shown only in equitation where the rider is being judged. Entry blanks will be accepted ONLY when signed by the owner, rider or handler AND trainer. Entries received after the closing deadline will incur a one time late charge of \$20. Entries submitted online will be accepted until 8:00 pm Thursday without incurring a late charge. MANAGEMENT RESERVES THE RIGHT TO CHARGE A NON-SHOWING FEE OF \$60 TO ANY HORSE NOT ACCUMULATING ENTRY FEES OF \$60.

Stabling

\$95 per stall/tack stall. Stalls are of temporary construction, in permanent buildings or tents. Stalls are 10'x10' with stall doors provided. Stalls are sold strictly on a first come first served basis. No stall will be reserved without payment. Please send stall reservations in early to ensure enough stalls are available. Contact Jenniffer at 614-496-5222 for all stabling needs.

Stalls will be available at 9:00 am on Thursday. Stalls must be vacated by 9:00 pm on Sunday.

A Haul-In fee will be charged for all compe tors showing out of their trailer at \$25 per day. All trailers must park in approved areas. Haul-In Exhibitors must check in at the show office before schooling/showing.

Motorized Vehicles

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Jump Order

A rota ng jump order will be established with the starter. Exhibitors must check in with the Starter to establish order of go. In some instances management may u lize a posted order of go. Orders will be posted at least 1 hour before the start of a class. If you have a ring conflict, you must check with the starter to determine how to resolve the conflict. Remember, it is YOUR responsibility to ensure that you are on the starters list and that you show up for your class on me.

Refunds

No Stall Fees Will Be Refunded. Entry fees will not be refunded unless a cerficate of illness or injury prepared by an accredited veterinarian is presented to the secretary before the start of the show. Once the show has started, horses which are not shown in classes which they have entered forfeit their entry fees, unless the horse has been scratched in the show office on an official scratch form prior to the start of the class. If a horse is injured or becomes ill prior to the class or classes entered, proper no fica on of the scratch must be made in the show office and be accompanied by a cer ficate from a veterinarian.

NO NUMBERS WILL BE RELEASED UNTIL PROPER CREDENTIALS AND ALL SIGNATURES ARE IN ORDER.

All exhibitors must have their current membership cards with them or a copy thereof, or send a copy of their card with their entry blank. All exhibitors in the Pony and Junior Hunter sec ons must present their measurement cards at the office before numbers will be released. All Pony or Junior Hunters who do not possess a current measurement card will be measured at a me and place to be announced. PLEASE INCLUDE COPIES OF MEASUREMENT CARDS WITH ENTRIES TO FACILITATE PROCESSING. All exhibitors in Amateur sec ons must present their amateur cer fica on at the office before numbers will be released. PLEASE INCLUDE COPIES OF AMATEUR CARDS WITH ENTRIES TO FACILITATE PROCESSING.

Administra on Fee

An administra on fee of \$30.00 per horse will be charged.

PLEASE TAKE NOTE

A processing fee of \$75.00 plus collec on fees will be made for any Nonnego able checks.

Non-showing horses whether stabled on the grounds, or hauling in may be assessed a fee of \$60.00 in addi on to stabling charges.

Prize Money will be credited to each exhibitor's account. Any credit due will be mailed within 30 days following each show. No prize money will be mailed unless owner's (or other designated payee's) social security number and complete address are listed on the entry blank.

Any exhibitor leaving the grounds before se ling their bill in the office may be charged a \$75 fee.

All Major credit cards are accepted as a form of payment. A \$15 service fee per horse will apply to accounts se led by credit card.

Medical Waste

In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of all medical waste.

Add/Scratch RDNE

SAME DAY ADDS WILL BE ACCEPTED WITH A CHARGE OF \$5 PER CLASS. Please ensure that all of your adds are submitted before the horse show office closes the day before you intend to show. Online adds (if available) will be accepted until 8:00 pm the day prior to the scheduled class. There will be no fee for scratching any class if scratched prior to the start of the class. RDNE Rode Did Not Enter fee of \$25 per occurrence will be charged to all horses showing in a class in which they have not previously been entered. Per USEF rules, horses will not be eligible for an award in the class if they were not added prior to the start of the class.

Rules and Regula ons

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

All ques ons not covered in these rules and regula ons shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final.

Every horse entered for compe on will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condion of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

The management reserves the right to refuse, accept condionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes a er due no ce to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges.

Exhibitors are no fied that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees. Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from a ending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensa on.

It is the tradi on of the show that riders be correctly a red for the class in ques on, that a endants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discre on bar any person from entering the ring if not suitable presented to appear before an audience.

Management

Management reserves the right to cancel or combine classes if insufficient entries warrant. Where USEF Rules do not apply, it is our policy to combine classes with 4 or fewer entries. Management reserves the right to refuse any entry. The Equivents Horse Show, it's officers, officials and employees will not be responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to an exhibitor, spectator, guest, rider, groom, a endant or other employee, animal or equipment at the show. THIS SHALL BE A CONDITION OF ENTRY TO THE SHOWS OR SHOW GROUNDS.

Management reserves the right to change scheduled class loca ons or start mes for any reason, me constraints or any other reason management decides is best for the horses well being and compe on.

Coggins

Proof of nega ve Coggins Test within one year is required of every horse entering Equivents Equestrian Complex. Out of state horses must be accompanied by a current Cer ficate of Veterinary inspec on (within 30 days). This paperwork must accompany all horses on arrival. Do not send with entries.

Schooling/Longeing

The Show Ring s will be available for schooling from 10:00 am un | 17:00 pm on Thursday weather permi | ng. Ring 2 will be open on Friday from 10 am un | 17 pm weather permi | ng. Flatwork only in the mornings. NO HORSE WILL BE PERMITTED TO SCHOOL UNTIL A SIGNED ENTRY BLANK IS ON FILE IN THE OFFICE

It is compulsory for riders in all Hunter, Jumper and Hunt Seat Equita on classes where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the compeon grounds to wear properly fastened protecove headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly field with harness secured. Boot/shoes worn while riding anywhere on the compeon grounds must have a disinguishable heel.

Longeing is not permi ed in the show rings at any me. There are designated areas for longeing available

Poling

Manual Poling and the use of Offsets are prohibited at all mes on the Show Grounds. In the event of a viola on of this regula on, the involved horse and its trainer of record as indicated on the entry blank may be suspended from further compe on at this show.

Arenas

Ring 1 is 140'x280'. Ring 2 is 120'x210' All rings and a ached schooling areas are footed with a sand cushion on a limestone base.

Dogs

NEW USEF DOG RULE. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule must/will be issued a Yellow warning card by the steward or any compe on official. Dogs are not permi ed to be loose on compe on grounds at any me and must be held on a leash or otherwise restrained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or ac ons resul ng from their dogs' behaviors. Immediately following the receipt by the Federa on of a third Yellow Warning Card indica ng that a compe tor, spectator, or par cipant has been issued three (3) Yellow Warning Cards within a (16) month period the Execu ve Director shall either levy a fine ranging from \$500 to \$1000 or a formal Charge pursuant to this Rule and GR604 alleging that the rules have been violated on all or any one of said three occasions pursuant to Chapter 6 of the Rules.

All Hunters

Courses will simulate fences found in the hun ng field such as: brush, wall, in-and-out, oxers, post & rails, gate, aiken and panels. In some classes the area of the Courtesy Circle may be restricted by a mandatory line. This line will be indicated on the course diagram and a corresponding barrier will be erected in the ring. All classes will be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise noted. Trophy and eight ribbons will be presented in each hunter class unless otherwise noted. A Champion and Reserve Champion tle will be awarded to two of the four horses acquiring the most points over fences in each hunter sec on. In addi on to these points, only these four horses will receive full points for one under saddle class. Full Championship points will be given in all classes in each hunter sec on, unless otherwise stated.

Upon entering, exhibitors will receive an official EQUUS Founda on BPC armband from the show office and will wear the armband while compe ng. The winners are the exhibitors who, in the opinion of the judges, exhibit the best overall compe ve performance at the show and accumulate points based on the number of class entries at the show in the official USEF BPC standings.
